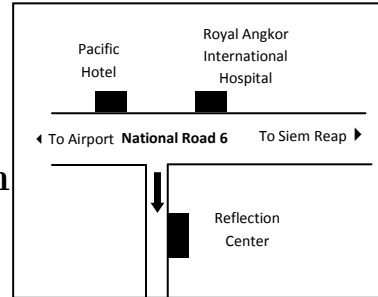

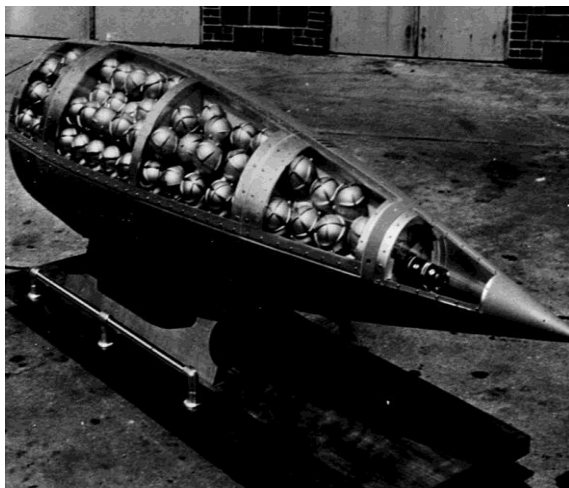

BAN CLUSTER BOMBS

WHAT ARE CLUSTER BOMBS?

A cluster bomb or cluster munitions, consists of a container filled with lots of smaller bombs (submunition). These containers might be dropped from the aircraft or fired from the ground. Breaking open in midair, the container releases the submunition saturating an area the size of several football fields.

HOW MANY COUNTRIES PRODUCE AND STOCKPILE CLUSTER MUNITIONS?

- 34 countries are known to have produced over 210 different types of cluster munitions. These include projectiles, bombs, rockets, missiles and dispensers.
- At least 75 countries currently stockpile cluster munitions. Current stocks amount to millions of cluster munitions, containing billions of individual submunitions.
- Victims of cluster munitions can currently be found in Afghanistan, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cambodia, Chad, Chechnya, Croatia, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iraq, Israel, Kosovo, Kuwait, Laos, Lebanon, Montenegro, Nagorno-Karabakh, Saudi Arabia, Serbia, Sierra Leone, Sudan, Syria, Tajikistan, Vietnam and Western Sahara.
